The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mrs. Allcorn. To commemorate Patriot's Day, in memory of those who lost their lives in the attack on America seven years ago, Mrs. Allcorn called for a moment of silence and also read a poem entitled "We Became One."

PUBLIC HEARING ON CAPITAL FACILITIES FUND/DEVELOPER FEES

Mrs. Allcorn open ed the public hearing regarding the Capital Facilities Fund and Developer Fees. There were no requests to address the board and the public hearing was closed.

STAFF REPORTS

Mrs. Rosemary Eadie presented a Powerpoint report on the District's STAR test results from spring 2008 where she reported that our students performed exceptionally well. Only two parents requested testing waivers. Our students in grades 2-8 were tested in English/Language Arts, Math, Writing (grades 4 and 7), Science (grades 5 and 8) and History/Social Studies (grade 8). Mrs. Eadie reminded the board that by the year 2014, California has declared that all students shall score at "proficient or advanced" in ELA and Math. In the Fountain Valley School District, all of our students increased in those performance levels in English-Language Arts with the exception of 5th grade, which decreased two percentage points. Mrs. Eadie attributed these exceptional gains to our reading specialists, spotlight teachers and the district's remediation programs. In math, percentages of our students at the proficient or advanced levels increased in all grades. The District's API growth was exceptional this year, with the District and all schools experiencing a rising API score over the past two years with the exception of Newland, which showed no growth. Dr. Ecker pointed out that Cox School, which has a high number of Hispanic, English learner and disadvantaged sub-groups, showed exceptional growth within those sub-groups. Mrs. Eadie also commended our students and teachers on our excellent scores in writing with 65% of 4th graders and 93% of 7th graders scoring a "5" or higher. The Fountain Valley School District demonstrated higher achievement than California and Orange County in every grade level and in all areas of the STAR and CAT/6 tests. Mrs. Eadie indicated her pride in our students and teachers.

BOARD REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Mrs. Lew said she had recently hosted a dinner at her home for members of the Fountain Valley Educational Foundation board and PT leaders and was delighted to have gained some new members to the Foundation. Mrs. Lew shared a packet of information including a Foundation membership flyer and a flyer advertising the 2008 "Taste of Fountain Valley." Said that she and Dr. Ecker would soon be visiting some corporate sponsors to share the 7-minute video about the Foundation and inquire about future donations. Said that channel 3 has agreed to show the video and to include advertising for "Taste of Fountain Valley."

Mrs. Harney said she had attended the dinner at Mrs. Lew's home and thanked her for hosting such a lovely event.

Mrs. Allcorn said she had greeted the District's new teachers at an orientation and enjoyed welcoming them to the District's family. Mrs. Allcorn visited Oka and Newland to view their new "peanut free" lunch tables and said the tables are designated and well maintained.

NEW ITEMS OF BUSINESS

Mrs. Allcorn: Spoke about the Board Interest to create a manual of District "Standard Operating Procedures" and explained to board members that at the next board meeting, the board would engage in a study session to discuss a list of protocols. Asked her colleagues on the board to familiarize themselves with the protocol worksheet and be prepared to address each one on October 16.

Dr. Ecker: Said if board members felt some of the protocols were an important operational procedure that should be addressed in the future manual, they should be so listed. The focus of the manual will be to help future board members as they come on the Board to know more about the District. Dr. Ecker also explained that this would be a "living" document which will be updated as procedures evolve over the coming years.

Mrs. Lew: Pointed out the beautifully framed artwork that is now hanging in the District Office hallways and also in the Board Conference Room. There is one piece of art from each school.

Dr. Ecker: Thanked Mrs. Eadie for her STAR report and the good news it contained, but warned that the State's rising bar will present increased challenges in the years ahead. Said the 2008 STAR test results again place Fountain Valley School District as the highest achieving elementary district in Orange County, and 3rd District overall of the 29 Orange County school districts. Commended our teachers for working hard to analyze data and learning how to use that data throughout the year in instruction that is data-driven.

Dr. Ecker: Said it appears the District has been selected for another Golden Bell Award for its preschool program at Newland School.
